Mary, Mother of God, Mary, Mother of Peace,
Mary, Queen of Peace!

As we enter the **New Year 2017**, we turn toward Mary, our Mother in Heaven! On the first day of every new year, we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, the **Holy Mother of God**. We have just rejoiced in the coming on earth of the Son of God a week ago. We now **rejoice** in acknowledging that Mary, as Mother of Jesus, is also the Mother of God, as Jesus is truly both Man and God. We **rejoice** as we now have a **Mother** always ready to intercede for us in heaven! In the same way **Jesus** came to us through **Mary**, we too can come to **Jesus** through **Mary: Mary leads us to Jesus!**

It is not by accident that we continue to celebrate the first day of every new year as the **World Day of Peace!** At Christmas, we celebrated the infant **Jesus** as the **Prince of Peace!** As Mary is the Mother of God, she is also the Mother of the Prince of Peace, she is the **Queen of Peace**. All of us search for peace. Peace in the World! Peace in our country! Peace in our own community! Peace in our own families! Peace in our own hearts! We cannot find peace unless we turn our hearts toward God and we cannot change alone: Mary, our Mother, is always ready to help us to change!

God is all merciful! **God is Mercy...**and Mary, the Mother of God is also the **Mother of Mercy!** Mercy and Peace! In the same way Mary leads us to Jesus, Mary also leads us to the **merciful love of God**. We have just completed a Holy Year of Mercy. As I announced earlier, our parish has just begun a new liturgical year focused on Mary, Mother of Mercy as we are preparing to celebrate the **100th Anniversary** (on May 13, 2017) of the first apparition of Mary at **Fatima**. The message of Mary at Fatima was a message of peace for the whole world (in the middle of World War I), but also a message for the need for **reparation of sin**: reparation of the sins of the world, reparation of our individual sins. Today, 100 years later, the message of Fatima remains relevant: we may not have a full-fledged World War III as in the first two World Wars; we are facing an increase of global terrorism affecting all countries, as well as continuing or escalating wars in many countries –Africa, Eastern Europe and the Middle East, at the same time including Libya, Somalia, Ukraine, Yemen, Syria, Iraq, Afghanistan. So, we need to continue to pray for **peace**, not only today, on the World Day of Peace, but every day of our lives. Peace begins in the heart of each one of us. To attain that individual peace, we have to receive God’s mercy, we have to pray for the reparation of our sins and those of the whole world (as relevant today as it was 100 years ago, when communism was emerging as a threat to our Christian world).

Let us pray that **Our Lady** will inspire each of us and the whole world in turning toward **God** throughout the whole **New Year 2017!** Let us pray the **Holy Spirit** will continue to inspire and guide all of us at **OLHOC!** May each one of us

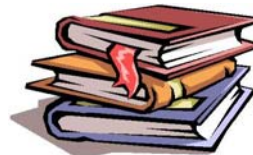
The Epiphany of the Lord
