Where Can I Find Happiness ?

Are you happy? Where can you find true happiness?

These are the questions that I asked many of you last week-end. These are foundational questions. We all seek **happiness!** St. Thomas Aquinas spoke extensively about **happiness** and the **purpose of man**. He debated seven questions in great detail, one by one: "Can I find happiness in wealth (money)? In pleasure? In power? In honor (prestige)? In any good of the body? In any good of the soul? In any created good?" St. Thomas Aquinas categorically answered: "No!" to each of these 7 questions. For him (one of the greatest minds and saints of all time) the source of happiness was very clear: **one can find happiness only in God**, who is the source of all good. Though St. Thomas Aquinas lived in the 13th century (more than 700 years ago), his deep insights resonate within each of us today. Yes, we may find some kind of happiness in the short term through honor, pleasure, power or money, but this happiness is **not the one God intends for us** and we know it can last only a limited time. We are created to know, love and serve God. (Baltimore Catechism). Our deep **sense** of happiness, peace and joy can come only when we know that we are doing God's will.

Jesus gives us clear answers on how to find the way to happiness! One of his most famous teachings is the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew Chapters 5, 6, and 7). Last week, we heard the beginning, The Beatitudes (Chapter 5: 1-12); over the next few weeks, we will hear more from this amazing sermon in which Jesus teaches all of us how we can be truly his followers, his disciples. **Beatus**, in Latin, means **happy** or **blessed**. The Beatitudes teach us how to find that happiness we all look for. There is no reference to wealth, pleasure, power, or prestige. It is just the opposite. Happy are the poor! Happy are those who suffer! Happy are the meek! Happy are the humble, the lowly, those who are persecuted!

Pope Benedict XVI wrote: " Behind the Beatitudes stands the figure of Christ, the man who is God, but who precisely because he is God, descends, empties himself all the way to death on the Cross... The **happy/blessed** par excellence is only **Jesus**. He is in fact the true poor in spirit, the one afflicted, the one hungering and thirsting for justice, the merciful, the pure of heart, the peacemaker, the one persecuted for the sake of justice...we are all invited to follow **Jesus** and to participate in His Blessedness...With Him, the impossible becomes possible." We are called to **imitate Christ**, as the only way to find **happiness** right now, right here on earth, and then forever in Heaven!

Where can I find true happiness? Think about your own experience, your own desires. Where have you been seeking that lasting happiness: in money, pleasure, power of honor/prestige? Where have you found it? We are all invited to think less of ourselves and the think of the other, especially to love and serve the one most in need!
