"Lord, I Have Chosen To Do Your Will..."

"Lord, I have chosen to do your will; may your hand be always there to strengthen me!" I have read this beautiful paraphrase of verse 173 of Psalm 119 hundreds of times as they are included regularly in the Liturgy of the Hours, which priests pray every day (Saturday Daytime Prayer, Week IV of Psalter) — but only last Saturday did it resonate in my heart. I simply stopped and re-read it three times. It was kind of another 'aha' moment. On that particular day, I felt totally at peace (which is rare) and what struck me was the boldness of the psalmist: how can one dare say I have chosen to do your will?

Yes, God has given freedom to each of us. Every day we make many choices, most of the time small ones, at times major ones (e.g., buying a house, getting engaged, choosing which college to apply to). Whenever we pray the Our Father, the most powerful prayer given to us by Jesus Christ, we ask God that "His will be done!".

We know that even Jesus, as a man, was tested and challenged to accept the will of His Father at a crucial time: the Agony in the Garden, the First Sorrowful Mystery on which we meditate every Tuesday and Friday when praying the Rosary. As God, Jesus knew that the hour had come for him to be arrested, to be flagellated, to be crowned with thorns, to carry his cross and finally to die through the most scandalous way for the Son of God: crucifixion! In the Agony in the Garden of Gethsemane, "Jesus began to feel sorrow and distress...he fell prostrate in prayer saying: "My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet, not as I will, but as You will." (Matthew 26: 3739). Then, Jesus said to Peter:" So, you could not keep watch with me for one hour? Watch and pray that you may not undergo the test. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak." (Matthew 26: 40-41).

Jesus demonstrates his humanness. He is distraught. He shows his emotion. However, he is totally obedient to the will of the Father. **He chooses to do God's will!** By doing His Father's will and accepting to die on a cross, the whole world will be transformed once for all! None of us is faced with such dramatic choices. However, the example of Jesus' Passion and Death strengthens each of us. It gives us courage and perseverance. Many times, we may feel like St. Paul when he says: "I do not do the good I want, but I do the evil I do not want." (Romans 7:19). However, we should keep striving for doing God's will! We cannot do it alone. We need God, we need God's hand to strengthen us.

Next time you face an important choice, I invite you to meditate on verse 173 of Psalm 119, which you can paraphrase by saying: "Lord, I am choosing to do Your will. May your hand be always there to strengthen me!" Lord, help me to discern what is Your will, not my will. Lord, always give me the strength to choose your will, not mine! Lord, help me not to be discouraged when I fail to obey your commands! Lord, help
