St. Augustine's Reflection on the Temptation of Jesus

As we reflected on the Gospel reading of the First Sunday of Lent last week (Mt. 4: 1-11), several of you asked: "Why was Jesus tempted by the devil?" As Jesus is both man and God, how is it that Satan dared to tempt Jesus after he had fasted forty days and forty nights in the desert? Saint Augustine in his commentary on the psalms (Psalm 61: 2-3) gave his own answer and it could be summed up in one sentence: "In Christ we suffered temptation and in Him we overcame the devil" (a full_explanation is given in the Office of Readings on the First Sunday of Lent). The psalmist says: "Hear, O God, my petition, listen to my prayer. I cried from the ends of the earth while my heart was in anguish." St. Augustine continues: "Our pilgrimage on earth cannot be exempt from trial. We progress by means of trial...Christ chose to foreshadow us, who are His body...he made us one with Him when He chose to be tempted by Satan." In other words, Christ suffered temptation as a man, and he overcame temptation of his own power as man, resisting Satan's three consecutive temptations by referring to **God's word** in Scriptures (Old Testament). Like Christ, we too will be tempted, but like Christ, we too can be victorious over temptation._As God, Jesus could have kept the devil away from him. But had He not been tempted, he could not have taught us how we can "triumph over temptation".

Another question is often asked: "Is temptation a sin?". Following the above commentary from St. Augustine, one could affirm: "It is not!" We know that Jesus as a man was tempted. We also know that Jesus as God cannot commit any sin. This may be another reason why Jesus was tempted. As disciples of Christ, we are all to strive to follow Jesus' example as well as His teachings. Jesus often speaks about the tribulations we will have to face in our life on earth. While temptation is not a sin, resisting temptation strengthens our own relationship with Jesus.

A third question often asked: "Who tempts us?" From Jesus' own experience in the desert, we can affirm that the devil is the one who tempts us. From Eve's own interaction with the serpent at the beginning of creation (Genesis 2: 7-9, 3: 1-7), we can also affirm that it is indeed the devil, through his lies and deception. However, from Adam's experience, one could say that we may be tempted directly by other human beings without being aware that it is the devil at work through others—a child who disobeys his parents may defend himself by saying that it is his brother or sister who made him disobey.

As we continue our **Lenten journey**, I invite everyone to **reflect on the role of temptations in our lives**. Last time we committed a major sin, why did we do so? We know that as we have been created with free will, we can also say no to the choices offered to us by the devil. Why have we been unable to resist temptations? One suggestion to avoid to succumb to temptation comes from **St. Francis de Sales**. He states the best way to resist temptation is to resist from the very beginning of temptation, as the longer you wait to fight temptation, the more difficult it will be to be victorious.

Lent is a time of **repent and reconcile**. As you prepare to go to confession this Lent and you examine your conscience, take some time to go deeper and to better understand the root of individual sins. May God help each of us to make the decision to go to confession this Lent. May God help each of us to make a deep examination of conscience.
