#### Five Messages From Fatima: P. R.A.R.S.!

It has now been about three weeks since we returned from a most amazing **pilgrimage to Fatima** and several Marian sites in France. Throughout the 11 days of the entire pilgrimage the early messages we heard in the first three days (a long transatlantic flight and two full days in Fatima itself) resonated to the ears of our 40 pilgrims from Waldorf. As I was making a short presentation to our parishioners on the First Saturday of this month (September 1st), right after the 9 am Mass (everyone is invited to some food, fellowship and reflection at 10 am every First Saturday), I summarized **in five points** the messages I personally took away from Fatima, but also from my personal experience of the entire pilgrimage. Here they are in an order, not of priority, but in an order to remember them through the acronym PRARS.

- 1. **PEACE**: Our Lady of Fatima invites all of us to Pray for Peace Daily! The world was in the midst of World War I in 1917. The need to pray for peace is as important today as it was 100 years ago. At the end of every daily Mass (9 am in our Chapel), we pray together for peace through the intercession of the Virgin Mary and the **Memorare** (Remember O Most Gracious Virgin Mary that never was it known that anyone...) peace in our hearts, peace in our families, peace in our communities, peace in our country, peace in the whole world.
- 2. ROSARY: Our Lady of Fatima invites all of us to Pray the Rosary Daily! If you have never prayed the Rosary, you can learn in five minutes; if you have not prayed the Rosary for quite some time, start again. Maybe start with one decade of the Rosary. Then, add another decade the following week. You will find the Rosary a beautiful way to meditate on the Mysteries related to Our Lord Jesus Christ, and to also find the presence of Mary as a mother who is always there to protect and lead us to Her Son! You can also join us any day at our church and pray the Rosary as a community (8:30 am every day, except on Sunday when we begin at 7:30 am).
- 3. ADORATION: The Angel of the Lord, who appeared to the three children in Fatima in 1916 (just a few months before the first apparition of Our Lady in May 1917), had several messages. The one that touched my heart the most this year is his call for Adoration of Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. Silent Adoration is an amazing experience. Initially, it may be a bit dry. But quickly, one can learn that by adoring Jesus in silence, we find an amazing peace, and are able to listen to Jesus whispering in our hearts! We just completed this Saturday at 5 pm, 37 continuous hours of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, one for each year of existence of our parish! If you missed coming for one hour of Adoration this week, you can come any day at 8 am at our church and find the Blessed Sacrament exposed on the altar.
- 4. RECONCILIATION/REPARATION OF SINS: Our Lady of Fatima invites us to reconcile with God (Sacrament of Reconciliation-Confession). She also invites us to pray for the Reparation of our own sins and those of the whole world, and therefore, to pray for the Conversion of Sinners. Try to come to Confession once a month! Come on five First Saturdays consecutively and receive many blessings by receiving the Eucharist, going to Reconciliation (Confession)

5. **SACRIFICE:** Our Lady of Fatima invites us to offer to God our own sufferings as a sacrifice. Sacrifice means "to make **Holy**" (Sacrum Facens, in Latin). Our Lady of Fatima invites us to accept our sufferings and to go beyond our comfort zone! Do whatever you do for the sake of getting closer to Jesus, for the sake of becoming holier!

As we are blessed by the visit of Cardinal McCarrick this weekend (11: 30 am Mass this Sunday), and we begin a **new day** for our entire parish community, I invite all of us to reflect on the above five simple messages from Our Lady of Fatima and see how they can assist us in our **journey of faith** in this extraordinary Jubilee Year of Fatima (ending this November).
