Come, Lord Jesus! Come, be my Joy!

Since the beginning of Advent the response to our Prayers of the Faithful has been **Come Lord Jesus!** This is what Advent is all about; a time of expectation, a time of awaiting the coming of Jesus in a manger in Bethlehem! The time has now come to celebrate this coming—**Christmas** has arrived! The **Joy** of **Christmas** has come upon us! As the prophet Isaiah reminds us (beginning of chapter 9): "The people who walked in darkness have seen a **great light... You** have brought them **abundant joy and great rejoicing! ...For a child is born to us, a son is given us...Prince of Peace!**"

This year is quite different celebrating Christmas on a Monday and **Christmas Eve on a Sunday!** In my 8 years of priesthood, I do not recall Christmas Eve falling on a Sunday. This means that as we gather this weekend (December 23-24) ...and as you read this weekly bulletin...we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Advent (in the morning) on the same day as Christmas Eve (beginning with 5:00 pm. Christmas Mass for children). Our Advent Season this year is the shortest ever: three weeks and one Sunday morning.

This short Advent Season does not mean that the **Joy of Christmas** will be diminished...on the contrary, I have found this year to be more joyous than ever! Many of you attended the first Mass of the nine Masses of Christmas (our annual Novena which we began four years ago) on Thursday, December 14. Over 250 of you came to anticipate the Joy of Christmas on that first evening of our Fifth Annual Novena. The music was spectacular in our renovated church! We could feel the presence of the Lord! Yes, **He is coming!** After the mass, most people stayed for fellowship in the narthex enjoying delicious soup and desert...and sharing the anticipated Joy of Christmas! We could already hear in our hearts the angel proclaiming to the shepherds: "Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you **Good News of Great Joy** that will be **for all people!** For **today** in the City of David a **Savior has been born** for you who is **Christ and Lord**." (Luke 2:10)...and suddenly there was a **multitude of the heavenly host** with the Angel saying, "**Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace** to those on whom His favor rests." (Luke 2:14) **Peace and Joy, Joy and Peace** — This is what **Christmas** is all about!

In his book, "Joy to the World," Scott Hahn emphasizes that Christmas makes us different. Christmas sets us apart. Christmas calls us to share in divine love...and then to share that love with an unbelieving world. Not only does Christmas set us apart from other religions, Christ's coming changed everything and still does! That changing of everything comes directly from the immense love God has for each one of us: "God so loved the world that he gave his only son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life." (John 3:16) When Jesus came to the world born in Bethlehem, the world was transformed! Never before seen, God became man and that union of God with mankind transformed the world: Everything changed...The Mystery of the Incarnation, God becoming man leads to the Paschal Mystery: Jesus dying on the cross and taking away all our sins, followed by His Resurrection and Ascension into Heaven...giving us all the Hope that one day we too, will be reunited with God in Heaven! The Joy of Christmas leads to the Joy of Easter! Without Christmas there is no Easter. Without Easter there is no Christmas. The Joy of Christmas and the Joy of Easter are ONE!

Shortly after he was elected pope, **Pope Francis** published a beautiful exhortation letter: "**The Joy of the Gospel**" (November 2013). In this letter, Pope Francis highlights the importance of **Joy** to evangelize those who never followed Christ or those whom no longer follow Him. He writes, "**The Joy of the Gospel** fills the hearts and lives of **all who encounter Jesus**. Those who accept his offer of salvation are set free from sin, sorrow, inner emptiness and loneliness. **With Christ, Joy is constantly born anew!**" Our Christian lives are all about encountering Christ! Our encounter with Christ begins at Christmas! I asked children recently who was Jesus for them. They gave many good answers: Jesus is my Savior, Jesus is my Best Friend, Jesus is my Teacher, Jesus is my King. One child gave me an unusual answer: "**Jesus is my Joy!**" I invite everyone at Christmas to reflect on these insightful words: **Jesus is my Joy!**

We all know that life is challenging. We all face many difficulties in our daily lives. But as Christians, we know that all these sufferings are nothing compared to the **Joy of Encountering Christ!** As a parish community, we have many reasons to be **grateful to God!** In my seven years as your pastor, I have found **much JOY** and that **JOY** comes from each one of **YOU**—The Joy of being a **family of families!** The Joy of being united in our Lord Jesus Christ! The Joy of seeing Christ in each of you! As we gather with our friends and families in celebrating Christmas, let us rejoice and praise the Lord for all the blessings He is pouring on each one of us every day of our lives!

Let us pray that the Joy of Christmas will fill our hearts! Let us says with Pope Francis that with Christ, Joy is constantly born anew! Let us pray that as we kneel down to adore Jesus, the newborn King, we can rejoice in our hearts with the shepherds and angels: Come, Lord Jesus! Come, be my Joy! Come, Lord Jesus! Come, fill my heart with your divine love! Come, Lord Jesus, help me to share my JOY with all around me!
