## Walking with Mary, Mother of God!

On the first day of every New Year, we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God! Happy Feast Day of Mary and Happy New Year to all of you! Since All Saints Day this year, November 1st, we closed the centennial Year of Fatima and began our mini-year of Mary at OLHOC: WALKING WITH MARY ON THE ROAD OF INTENTIONAL DISCIPLES OF CHRIST!

We had an excellent start on the first Saturday of November this year (Nov. 4) with about 150 people joining the 9 AM Mass and First Saturday Devotion. The following day, Sunday (Nov. 5), began the 33-day consecration to Jesus through Mary (following St. Louis de Montfort). For the first time ever in our parish, over 100 of us completed those 33 days of consecration prayer, encouraged to imitate Mary's virtues: profound humility, lively faith, blind obedience, continual mental prayer, mortification in all things, surpassing purity, ardent charity, heroic patience, angelic sweetness, divine wisdom! 10 Principle Virtues of Mary as identified by St. Louis de Montfort.

We are still enjoying the taste of the fruits of the great celebration of the birth of Jesus. As usual, the music at all Christmas Masses was superb! Everyone joined in singing along our favorite Christmas hymns; what joy in singing! There was the great joy of all being united: One in Christ! There was the joy of seeing so many families coming in large numbers to celebrate as one family of families our own OLHOC parish. One of my own greatest joys was to see the joy of the many children participating at our Mass on Christmas Eve (the 5PM Mass). This year we enjoyed something new: a Youth Ensemble playing Christmas Music as well as children dressed as Angels and Shepherds welcoming all parishioners as they entered our Narthex as early as one hour ahead of the Mass. The Angels and Shepherds distributed hearts reminding us of God's Love; immense love for each of us. On each heart were written three simple phrases summing up what Christmas is all about: "Jesus you are my Joy! I love you! I give you my heart!" Also, as a first, everyone was invited to come and adore baby Jesus in the manger at the end of Mass! We could feel the presence of the Holy Spirit, the mystical spouse of Mary! We could feel the joy of being one in Christ as we received the Body and Precious Blood of Christ!

While we continue to walk with Mary, Mother of God, in the very beginning of this New Year 2018, we are reminded that Mary always leads us to Jesus in the same way that Jesus comes to us through Mary (her womb)! We are also reminded that Mary and Jesus are truly one: their two hearts are one from the moment of Jesus' Conception and are still one in heaven (where Mary and Jesus are reunited, with Jesus remaining our King and Mary being crowned Queen of Heaven and Earth). We are reminded that God never changes and that as Jesus is both God and man, Jesus can never change. In God, there is no sense of time nor space, but instead an unchanging supreme being: the Triune God (Mystery of the Holy Trinity: Three Persons in One God). We are also reminded that Jesus is One with the Holy Spirit, Mary's Mystical Spouse! We can feel the continuous Love of God for each one of us, through the love of His son Jesus, the love and constant presence of the Holy Spirit, and the unceasing, protecting and maternal God of Mary, Mother of God! Looking ahead, inspired by the Holy Spirit and with full trust in God's love and mercy, each of us is invited to consider making a New Year's resolution to continue walking with Mary on the road to becoming intentional disciples of Christ by choosing one or more of the following five actions/activities:

- 1. **FIRST SATURDAY DEVOTION**: (i) Attend the 9AM Mass for **five consecutive First Saturdays** (Jan. 6, Feb. 3, Mar. 3, Apr. 7, May 5, etc.); (ii) Come to **Reconciliation** once a month within a week of a First Saturday (one week before or after); (iii) Pray the **Rosary** on the First Saturday; (iv) **Meditate** for **15 minutes** on one of the Mysteries of the Rosary, and (v) Do all these activities in **reparation of our sins and those of the whole world.**
- 2. **33-DAY CONSECRATION TO JESUS THROUGH MARY**: (St. Louis de Montfort) Begin on **February 20** to end on the Feast of the Annunciation on March 25. If you were unable to begin or to complete the consecration prayers many of us did last November/December, you have one more opportunity! Come and attend the First Saturday morning talks being held right after the 9AM Mass (Jan. 5 or Feb. 3) and learn more about the powerful impact of consecrating your life to Jesus through Mary!
- 3. **PRAY THE ROSARY DAILY**: Like the First Saturday Devotion, this is one of the strong recommendations of Mary appearing at FATIMA! The Rosary is the most powerful prayer we have. It will help give you **peace and joy!** Join our daily 8:30AM Rosary in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel, or pray the Rosary daily at home with your family...or alone (while going to work, or taking a walk).
- 4. **COME TO RECONCILIATION MONTHLY**: We hold confessions (both in English and Spanish) every Saturday at 4PM (continuing if necessary thru the 5PM Mass, or after completion of the 5PM Mass). The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a **personal encounter with Christ** (the priest represents Christ in this amazing sacrament given to us by Jesus). Not only will you receive the absolution of your sins, but you will enter into a **conversion** process and receive the Holy Spirit! One of the key messages of **Fatima** is the need for **reconciliation**, **repentance and reparation!** Mary is inviting you to get closer to her Son Jesus through frequent confession. In addition, you are always to reconcile whenever you have committed a major sin, so as to be able to receive the Eucharist. Receiving the Eucharist in a state of major sin separates us **further** from Jesus.
- 5. **WEEKLY HOUR OF HOLY ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT**: Come spend **one Holy Hour every week** in front of the Exposed Blessed Sacrament! If you cannot spend a full one hour without interruption, come twice for 1/2 an hour, or four times for 15 minutes. Several of you have shared with me not knowing how to pray a full Holy Hour. Join me at 10AM this coming **Saturday, January 6**, to discuss how best to **spend One Holy Hour** with the **Lord**.

God bless all of us in this New Year of 2018! May the **Joy of Jesus Christ** fill our hearts in the weeks and months ahead! May the **Holy Spirit** help each of us **walk with Mary on the road to intentional discipleship!**
