GIVING THANKS TO GOD FOR HIS IMMENSE LOVE!

This Fourth Sunday of Easter is known as Good Shepherd Sunday as we celebrate Jesus' self-proclamation: "**I am the Good Shepherd.** A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep....I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I will lay down my life for the sheep." (John 10:11,14). Jesus is the only one prepared to **give His life for all of us!**

Saint **Peter**, filled with the Holy Spirit (right after Pentecost), says to the leaders and elders, and all of us: "**Jesus** is the stone rejected by you, the builders, which has become the cornerstone. There is no salvation through anyone else, nor is there any other name under heaven given to the human race by which we are to be **saved.**" (Acts 4:11-12). We can only be saved by Jesus, no one else!



In his First Letter, Saint **John** (1 John 3:1-2) also emphasizes the **immense love God has for each of us believers: Beloved:** "See what **love** the **Father** has bestowed on us that we may be **called the children of God.**" This **love** (Agape in Greek) is totally **unconditional.** God loves us the way we are. He is our loving Father and we are His Beloved ones!

The above readings in today's Mass (John's Gospel, Luke's Acts of the Apostles, and John's First Letter) proclaim the **Good News** of Our Lord Jesus Christ who saves us by **dying for us** and rising for us. Not surprisingly, this was one of the central themes of the first hour of the **Catechesis** which began this past Monday evening. Even if you might have missed the first two sessions, you are invited to attend the Catechesis as it continues on Mondays and Thursdays at 7:00 pm. One of the two seminarian members of the **Catechesis Team**, Pedro, gave a witness talk that linked amazingly his childhood's own suffering and his entering the seminary. One of his greatest sufferings as a child and adolescent came from the difficult relationship he had with an alcoholic father. With hindsight, Pedro affirmed that he would not be in the seminary today if his father had not been an alcoholic. While initially, his father led him away from God, in the end, Pedro's own suffering, through attending a **Catechesis** similar to the one being given now, led him to believe in God's Love, to come back to the church. God had a plan for Pedro. God loved Pedro the way he was then, and the way he is today. God's immense love is for each one of us! This is the **Good News** of the **Gospel!**

As some of you may know, I have had my own share of physical sufferings over the last few weeks. Though my suffering does not compare in any way with the major one our seminarian Pedro suffered over many years of having an alcoholic father, it is still hard for me to accept mine! My illness during the Holy Week required taking several health tests (mostly linked with difficulty in breathing and chest pain). None of us likes to spend time in doctors' offices...I still have to take one more test in a few days. In the middle of these tests, I had a car accident last week, and this brought me back to see doctors again for difficulty in breathing and chest pain, but this time caused by heavy pressure from seat belt and air bag. God has a sense of humor! Just a few hours before the car accident, my cardiologist had told me that if I felt any new chest pains, I should see a doctor immediately! I'm choosing to share with you my current physical sufferings so that you can encourage me to slow down! It is very hard for me to say "no" when someone asks for some help. In the coming days, I may have to decline more often and trust that the Lord will provide. As Seminarian Pedro shared, I also know that God loves me the way I am, including my own weaknesses and suffering. I also thank God for all the **love I have received** being your pastor (already seven years!). Our parish is well-known for our welcoming ways and loving everyone! I am one of those who have benefited much from that welcome and love!

As we continue our Easter Season Journey, I invite you to join our **Catechesis** on Mondays and Thursdays. Please also invite a family member or friend to join! I also invite you to begin the **33 days to Morning Glory**, even if you did not begin on Wednesday April 18. Start **today** and go to our website-click on **Marian Consecration**. Request to receive the daily meditations by text! Instead of completing on May 21st, you can complete four days later.



May we all feel in our daily life the love of the Good Shepherd! He is always there for each of us! May **He** help us to accept our shortcomings! May He send us **His Holy Spirit** to guide every step, every decision of our lives, and to give us **His Peace!**


