**Jesus Ascends and is with Us Always**

On this special day it's good for us to take time to remember and pray for our mothers, grandmothers, mothers-to-be and those special women who are like mothers to us. May the *Lord bless all mothers* for their hard work, many sacrifices and unconditional love. May he bless them especially for saying "Yes" to the gift of life.

Our next Outreach Committee Meeting before summer break is **June 6** at 7:00 PM in the Social Hall.




